\$750-million fund to improve broadband Internet access services in underserved areas

- The CRTC set new targets for these services:
- speeds of 50 Mbps download/10 Mbps upload for fixed broadband services
- an unlimited data option for fixed broadband services
- the latest mobile wireless technology available not only to all homes and businesses, but also along major Canadian roads

Federal: Connect to Innovate?

Provincial: In its 2018 Fall Economic Statement, the Government of Ontario committed to releasing a broadband and cellular strategy in early 2019.
