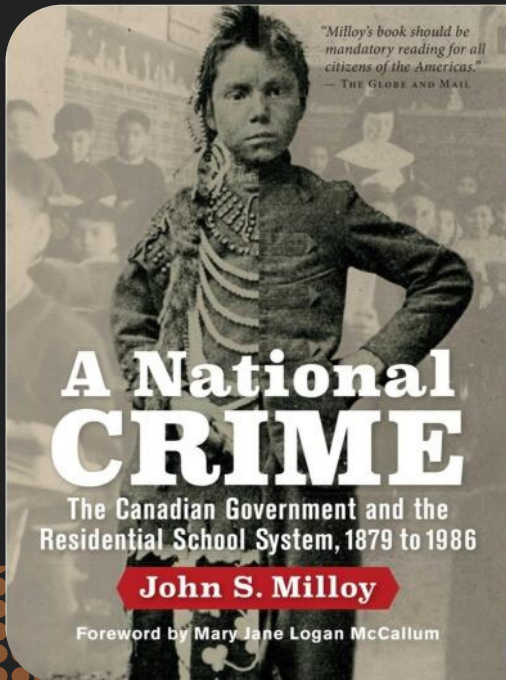


SAVE THE DATE SEPTEMBER 30

Reconciliation in Temagami N'DAKI-MENAN



KEYNOTE ADDRESS BY DR. JOHN S. MILLOY

September 30 is the National Day of Truth and Reconciliation. The day honours the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Our commemoration of the tragic and painful history and ongoing impacts of residential schools is a vital component of the reconciliation process.

Dr. John S. Milloy is a world-known expert on Canada's residential school system. Dr. Milloy will share his experience as the director of research and special adviser for the Truth and Reconciliation Commission (2008-2015). As a member of the Royal Commission on Aboriginal Peoples (1991-1996), Dr. Milloy researched and produced a detailed report, which was later published as a book *A National Crime: The Canadian Government and the Residential School System, 1879 to 1986*.

Presented by Living Temagami, the half-day event also includes ceremonial remembrance, sharing, and discussion of reconciliation actions specific to our communities. Program details to follow. Contact:
