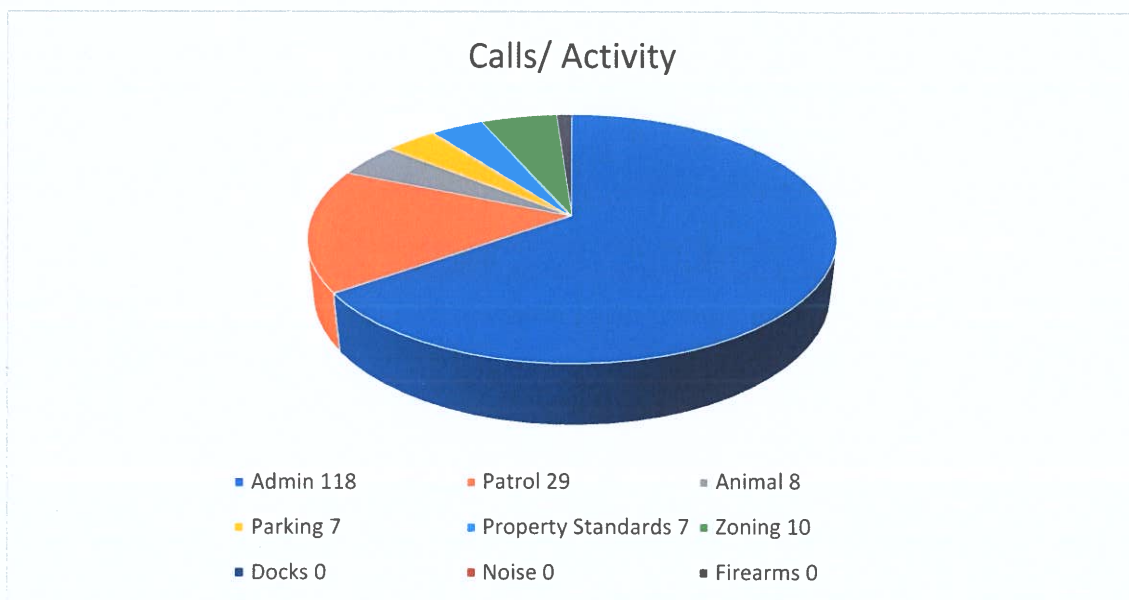
RECOMMENDATION

That the Council of the Municipality of Temagami receives this report pertaining to the activities of the Municipal Law Enforcement Officer/ Property Standards Officer/ Animal Control Officer (MLEO/ PSO/ ACO).

And Further That Council does hereby acknowledge that there was overall, a total of **Thirty-Four (34)** complaints/ calls or inquiries made by the residents of Temagami during the period of **03 Nov 2023 to 05 Dec 2023**, with the majority of calls/ actions addressing Property Standards, Parking and Zoning matters. This number does not include the anonymous complaints that have been received and / or acted upon.

INFORMATION

This report has been generated to provide the Municipality of Temagami, Mayor and Council a detailed account of the types of calls activities and duties that I have been addressing since my November 2023 Council Report.



PARKING INFRACTIONS;

One (1) Parking Infraction Notices/ Tickets have been issued since last Council meeting, which was voided by the MLEO due to compassion given to residential parking arrangement between the Municipality and RONNCO apartments on Lakeshore / Wildflower day parking area.

PARKING AND ADDITIONAL SIGNAGE;

3x new street parking signs were ordered and received for an overall amount of \$357.17. The new **NO STREET PARKING** signs address Winter Restricted Parking (Parking By-law 23-1698), from **01 NOVEMBER- 15 APRIL, 7:30 am to 12:00 am** daily, which will assist Public Works, during snow clearing operations.

Four (4x) quotes were obtained prior to selecting the **best price**.

One (1) NEW parking sign was erected 28 NOV/23, on Spruce Dr. It is the intentions of the MLEO to gradually phase in the restricted winter parking signs and the overall enforcement, in order to give the community members an opportunity to adapt, become educated and aware of the new signage, restrictions and potential Seventy-Five Dollar (\$75.00) Set-Fine penalty for offenders, as they relate to Parking By-law 23-1698, section 8.2.

BY-LAWS UPDATES;

The newly proposed changes to the Firearms By-law is currently under review and pending public consultation. We are planning for public consultation on 04 JAN 2024, to be held in the Bunny Miller Theatre, 1800hrs to 2000hrs.

Since last Council meeting we have prepared a Public Consultation Poster/ Flyer, gathered information and researched other municipalities firearms by-laws, in order to establish how they handled the concerns of those affected the most with any additional restrictions or potential by-law changes. We have prepared a questionnaire and power point presentation for concerned members of the community.

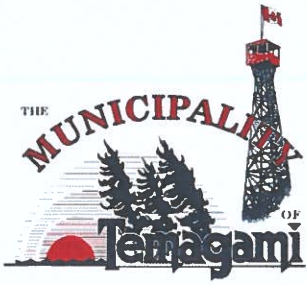
