February was a dynamic month for the Parks and Recreation Department, with the ice rink playing a central role in community activities. The facility saw increased usage, hosting various hockey events, training sessions, and recreational opportunities. These efforts continue to foster skill development, encourage community participation, and provide a space for both competitive and casual play. As we move into March, our focus remains on expanding these opportunities and enhancing programming for all age groups.

### Ice Rink Usage & Events

Throughout February, the ice rink was actively utilized for various programs and events:

- Hockey Tournaments: Four (4) tournaments were held, bringing together teams from multiple regions and drawing significant spectator engagement.
- Hockey Skills Classes: Four (4) specialized training sessions were conducted by Doug
  Poirier, providing young athletes with structured skill development.
- Team Practices: Eight (8) practices took place, with teams traveling from North Bay to New Liskeard to utilize the facility.
- Bear Island Youth Visits: Three (3) visits from Bear Island youth offered participants the opportunity to engage in hockey practice and skill-building exercises, strengthening relationships between communities.

As Shiver Fest 2025 approaches, final preparations are underway to ensure a successful and engaging festival. Additionally, Parks and Recreation is organizing a variety of activities for March Break, designed to offer fun and inclusive opportunities despite the rink's full rental schedule.  Public Skating and Sticks & Pucks Sessions: Open ice times for casual skating and informal hockey practice. • Human Bowling on Ice: A unique and entertaining activity where participants slide on

the ice in a game resembling bowling.

Movie Screenings at the Bunny Miller Theater:

• Specially curated films for seniors, providing a relaxed and social environment.

• Family-friendly movies for children and parents to enjoy together.

**Canteen Revenue** 

The canteen continued to see strong sales in February, reflecting sustained patronage and an

ongoing shift towards electronic transactions:

• Total Deposits: \$1,652.00

Square Transactions: \$1,432.12, indicating a growing preference for digital payments.

Square Fees Paid: \$26.71, with fees remaining below 2%, making Square the most cost-

effective payment method available.
