## Training

- February 4<sup>th</sup> - Members of the Marten River Fire Department attended the Fire Hall conducted inventory checks of all vehicles, inspected and tested all SCBA's and discussed the upcoming 2 +1 Highway pilot project.

- February 18<sup>th</sup> - Members of the Marten River Fire Department attended a lecture based on the Training Essentials of Firefighting 7, as well as Fire Safety and Communications.
- February 25<sup>th</sup> - Members of the Marten River Fire Department changed the sign out front of the station to remind the community about Fire Safety when using space heaters. Members also attended a presentation on Auto Extraction.

## Incidents

- February 17<sup>th</sup> Incident #1 ~ 3:26pm
  - Highway 64 south of Highway 11 at the hydro power line swath
  - Single Off-Road Vehicle Personal Injury collision
  - A snowmobile rider misjudged a large snowbank on the side of Highway 64 and as she attempted to cross the roadway, she lost control of her vehicle and flipped over. During the event, the rider injured her shoulder. Marten River Fire Dept Fire Fighters assessed and tended to her injury and remained with her until an Ambulance was able to transport her to the North Bay Regional Health Centre.

## Fire Prevention Initiatives

- Further, the Marten River Fire Department team members changed the sign out front of the fire hall to remind everyone about the importance of Fire Safety and Prevention regarding space heaters.
