1.Summary

The Parks and Recreation Department continued its commitment to maintaining and enhancing public spaces and providing quality recreational opportunities for residents and visitors throughout the month of June. Below is a summary of activities and accomplishments:

2. Key Activities and Accomplishments

- June 4 – Installation of the new scoreboard at the arena was successfully completed.
- June 6 – The Shared Shed was stained, improving both its appearance and durability.
- June 9 – Both baseball fields were prepared ready for the upcoming baseball tournament.
- Ongoing – Regular grass cutting took place at Spruce Park and Tracy & Kimmy Memorial Park
- Weekly – The skate park and playgrounds were inspected for safety and cleanliness.

3. Fire Tower Preparation

- June 19 – The Fire Tower was officially opened for the season.
- In preparation, the following tasks were completed:
 - Painting of the tower
 - Grass cutting and grounds maintenance

 - Fireworks show to conclude the evening
