#### 1. Overview

Throughout the month of July, the Parks and Recreation Department has remained active and committed to maintaining municipal assets, delivering community programs, and preparing for future events that will help enhance community engagement and tourism in Temagami.

#### 2. Programs and Events

- Ball Hockey has been introduced every Tuesday and Thursday from 6:00 pm to 8:00 pm at the Temagami Arena, drawing consistent community participation.
- Cornhole Nights have been running successfully and are held every Friday from 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm, providing a fun and inclusive activity for residents of all ages.

#### 3. Grounds and Maintenance

- The Parks and Recreation team completed grass cutting and general maintenance of all municipal parks, public trails, and roadside green spaces.
- Weekly inspections and safety checks were performed for all municipal playgrounds, the skate park, the Tower area, and the Chalet, ensuring all recreational spaces remain safe and in good condition for public use.

## 4. Trail Mapping and Restoration

- As part of a longer-term vision for improved trail access and event planning, the Parks
  and Recreation Manager provided support in mapping the trail system located behind
  the arena. These trails are part of Temagami North's older path networks, many of which
  are at risk of becoming overgrown and unrecognizable.
- One of these trails has been identified as a potential route for bringing back the
   "Christmas in the Country" event. The goal is to incorporate a trail display experience in
   combination with arena activities, enhancing community holiday programming and
   attracting more visitors to the arena grounds.
